- Students who plan to take upper-level science classes for their Environmental Studies Concentration – Specialization and Environmental Studies Concentration - Electives should plan carefully for prerequisites (i.e., take prerequisite courses as early as possible). Most upper-level science courses require prerequisites; for example, BIO 3302 Ecology and BIO 3313 Global Change Ecology both require the following prerequisites: BIO 1802 and RC 2001.

- **Residency Requirements:**
 - 30 hours must be from ASU (25% of the credit hours required in the degree).
