#### Additional Notes:

- Only one 1000 level ANT course may count towards the major.
- Students may **not** enroll in a course as a CAPSTONE if they have already taken the parallel seminar course.
- There are many opportunities to reorganize this four year plan. Please consult with your departmental advisor each term as you prepare for registration.



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- Please consult with your advisor to ensure you will complete the appropriate number of free electives as needed to reach the 120 total hours required for your degree.
- Summer Cultural Anthropology field schools offered through the department are also excellent options for elective courses, and may in some cases also substitute for ANT 3410.
- Study abroad is strongly encouraged and the program of study outlined here can be adjusted to accommodate study abroad in any semester.
- Foreign Language is optional, but strongly recommended. Advanced courses may count towards concentration if advisor concurs.
- Minor is optional.
- Departmental Honors: any course may be contracted as an HONORS course if the instructor agrees and the course is suitable; HONORS research and thesis courses can fill the “open courses” at the Senior level.
- Residency Requirements:
  - 30 hours must be from ASU
  - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
  - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
