Additional Notes:

- At least 3 hours of 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000-level HIS course; at least 3 hours of 3000-level HIS courses is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course. No more than 18 semester hours from the 2000 level including **HIS 2201**, **HIS 2204** and **HIS 2800**, may be included to fulfill Major Requirements. 1000-level HIS courses are not permitted to count towards History major requirements.
- Students are co-admitted to Reich College of Education (RCOE) in order to complete education courses and student teaching.
 - To be admitted to the Teacher Education Program students must have a minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA and take and satisfy testing requirements for Reading, Writing and Math areas of the PRAXIS (PPST or CBT). The PRAXIS II Area Exam is required for student teaching.



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- A minimum 2.70 overall GPA is required for admission to RCOE and must be maintained through graduation
- Mixing History and Social Studies requirements early in the program is recommended in order to avoid having to take more than 3 History courses at the same time late in the program.
- From their first semester, students interested in this major will be contacted by the program director with announcements of special meetings to give them information about program and the profession of teaching high school Social Studies.
- Please consult with your advisor to ensure you will complete the appropriate number of free electives as needed to reach the 120 total hours required for your degree.
- Residency Requirements:
 - 30 hours overall must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
