
## **Semester Two: [16 Credit Hours]**

At least 3 hours of 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000-level HIS course; at least 3 hours of 3000-level HIS courses is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course. No more than 15 semester hours from the 2000 level may be used to fulfill History Core Requirements (HIS 2800, Regional History Requirements, History Electives), and no more than 9 semester hours at the 2000 level may be used to fulfill requirements in the concentration. 1000-level HIS courses are not permitted to count towards History major requirements. For concentration requirements: No more than 3 hours from the 1000 level may be used to fulfill concentration requirements. At least 12 hours of the concentration must be at or above the 3000 level.



For concentration requirements: No more than 3 hours from the 1000 level may be used to fulfill concentration requirements. At least 12 hours of the concentration must be at or above the 3000 level.
- Mixing History and other requirements early in the program is recommended in order to avoid having to take more than 3 History courses at the same time late in the program.
