Semester Two: [16 Credit Hours]

At least 3 hours of 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000-level HIS course; at least 3 hours of 3000-level HIS courses is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course. No more than 15 semester hours from the 2000 level may be used to fulfill History Core Requirements (HIS 2800, Regional History Requirements, History Electives), and no more than 9 semester hours at the 2000 level may be used to fulfill requirements in the concentration. 1000-level HIS courses are not permitted to count towards History major requirements. For concentration requirements: No more than 3 hours from the 1000 level may be used to fulfill concentration requirements. At least 15 hours of the concentration must be at or above the 3000 level.

You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Liberal Studies Experience.

Additional Notes:

- The multidisciplinary concentration is available to students interested in various history-related careers. Examples of the Department of History's general areas of career orientation are business, government service, and public history, among others. Career concentrations are chosen by students in consultation with a faculty advisor and will be declared no later than the end of the first semester of your junior year.
- At least 3 hours, 2000-level HIS is required prior to taking a 3000 level HIS course; at least 3 hours, 3000-level HIS course is required prior to taking a 4000-level HIS course. No more than 15 semester hours from the 2000 level may be used to fulfill History Core Requirements (HIS 2800, Regional History Requirements, History Electives), and no more than 9 semester hours at the 2000 level may be used to fulfill requirements in the concentration. 1000-level HIS courses are not permitted to count towards History major requirements. For concentration requirements: No more than 3 hours from the 1000 level may be used to fulfill concentration requirements. At least 15 hours of the concentration must be at or above the 3000 level.
- Mixing History and other requirements early in the program is recommended in order to avoid having to take more than 3 History courses at the same time late in the program.



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- Please consult with your advisor to ensure you will complete the appropriate number of free electives as needed to reach the 120 total hours required for your degree.
- Residency Requirements:
 - 30 hours must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
