Additional Notes:

- Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence.
- Minor outside Spanish required for this degree.
- Foreign language requirement:
 - This plan is predicated on the assumption that entering freshmen who propose to major in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures with a concentration in Spanish have some language skill.
 - For students who place above SNH 1010, 1020, 1040 or 1050, those courses in the Four Year Guide should be replaced with Free Electives.
 - Due to the various levels at which students enter the language major, significant adjustments to the 4-year plan may be necessary.
 - Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence.
 - If SNH 1010 & 1020 taken for prerequisite purposes, they will count in place of 6 hours of Free Electives (3 hours per course).
 - SNH 1030 may substitute for SNH 1010 & 1020; SNH 1060 may substitute for SNH 1040 & 1050.
 - Foreign language classes can be taken in summer semesters.
- Students are required to demonstrate intermediate-level proficiency in a language other than English. Intermediate-level proficiency is demonstrated by successful completion of a 4th-semester language course (FL 1050 or 1060 or CSD 3374). A higher-level language course that requires one of these courses as a prerequisite may also be used to fulfill the requirement.
 - Placement exams are required for several languages. Should a student place higher than the beginning level, any lower level requirements listed on the four year guide will need to be replaced with a free elective if needed for total hours for the degree. Please consult with your advisor for more information.
 - **Note: Appalachian's language placement test is designed for placement purposes only, and a score on this test alone is not sufficient to demonstrate intermediate-level proficiency.**
- Appalachian State University participates many study abroad programs that offer a wide variety of courses that can be used to meet major requirements. Information about study abroad opportunities is available in the Office of International Education and Development All majors interested in studying abroad should discuss their plans in detail with an academic advisor a year or more in advance.



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- Residency Requirements:
 - 30 hours overall must be from ASU
 - 18 hours in the major must be from ASU
 - 9 hours in the minor must be from ASU
