You must also meet the Fine Arts, Literary Studies, Historical Studies, and the Social Science Designations. Those may be met within the Integrative Learning Experience and the Liberal Studies Experience.

Additional Notes:

- This plan is predicated on the assumption that entering freshmen who propose to major in Languages, Literatures, and Cultures with a concentration in French and Francophone Studies have some language skill.
 - o For students who place above FRE 1010, 1020, 1040 or 1050, those courses in the Four Year Guide should be replaced with Free Electives.
 - Due to the various levels at which students enter the language major, significant adjustments to the 4-year plan may be necessary.

• Foreign language requirement:

- Student must take the Foreign Language Placement Test to determine starting course for the foreign language sequence.
- Note: Appalachian's language placement test is designed for placement purposes only, and a score on this test alone is not sufficient to demonstrate intermediate-level proficiency.
- o If FRE 1010 & 1020 taken for prerequisite purposes, they will count in place of 6 hours of Free Electives (3 hours per course).
- FRE 1060 may substitute for FRE 1040 & 1050.
- Foreign language classes can be taken in summer semesters.
- Appalachian State University participates in a bilateral exchange program with the University of Angers that offers a wide
 variety of courses that can be used to meet major requirements. Information about other study abroad opportunities in
 French-speaking countries is available in the Office of International Education and Development All majors interested in
 studying abroad should discuss their plans in detail with an academic advisor a year or more in advance.
- Reading & English proficiencies required.
- Admission to Teacher Education is required. To be admitted to the Teacher Education Program students must have a
 minimum 2.7 cumulative GPA and take & satisfy testing requirements for Reading, Writing and Math areas of the PRAXIS
 (PPST or CBT).
- Graduation and licensure requires a cumulative 2.7 GPA.
- Please consult with your advisor to ensure you will complete the appropriate number of free electives as needed to reach the 120 total hours required for your degree.

Residency Requirements:

- o 30 hours overall must be from Appalachian State University
- o 18 hours in the major must be from Appalachian State University
- o 9 hours in the minor must be from Appalachian State University
