ACC 1050 - Survey of Accounting (3)



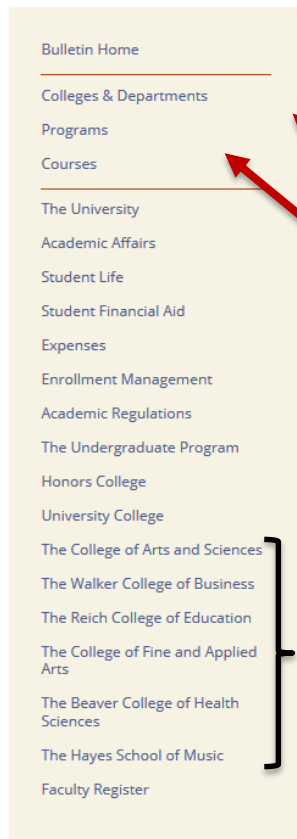
When Offered: Fall; Spring.
